18.5.8 Internal Quality Assurance Cell Quality Policy of Wings Business School

Introduction

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi proposes that every institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. The work of the IQAC is the first step towards internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Its success depends upon the sense of belongingness and participation it can inculcate in all the constituents of the institution. It will not be yet another hierarchical structure or a record-keeping exercise in the institution. It will be a facilitative and participative voluntary system/unit/organ of the institution. It has the potential to become a vehicle for ushering in quality enhancement by working out planned interventionist strategies to remove deficiencies and enhance quality like the “Quality Circles” in industries.

1. Primary Goals of Quality Policy:

1. To develop a quality system for conscious, consistent and Catalytic programmed action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the Institution.
2. To promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

2.Strategies

IQAC shall evolve mechanisms and procedures for

- a. Ensuring timely, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial tasks;
- b. The relevance and quality of academic and research programmes;
- c. Equitable access to and affordability of academic programmes for various sections of society;
- d. Optimization and integration of modern methods of teaching and learning;
- e. The credibility of evaluation procedures;
- f. Ensuring the adequacy, maintenance and proper allocation of support structure and services;
- g. Sharing of research findings and networking with other institutions in India and abroad.

3. Functions of IQAC:

- ✓ Development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for the various academic and administrative activities of the Institution.
- ✓ Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive for quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process.
- ✓ Arrangement for feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholder on quality-related institutional processes.
- ✓ Dissemination of information on the various quality parameters of higher education.
- ✓ Organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles.
- ✓ Documentation of the various programmes/activities of the Institution, leading to quality improvement.
- ✓ Acting as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including adoption and dissemination of good practices.
- ✓ Development of Quality Culture in the institution.

4. Benefits

IQAC will facilitate / contribute

- Ensure heightened level of clarity and focus in institutional functioning towards quality enhancement.
- Ensure internalization of the quality culture.
- Ensure enhancement and coordination among various activities of the institution and institutionalize all good practices.
- Provide a sound basis for decision-making to improve institutional functioning;
- Act as a dynamic system for quality changes in institution.
- Build an organised methodology of documentation and internal communication.
